Key West in December: Flip-Flops, Flamingos, and Festive Foolery!!

If you're dreaming of a white Christmas, Key West will politely redirect you to the nearest piña colada. Down here, December isn't about snowflakes—it's about sunshine, sequins, and the occasional drag queen descending in a giant red stiletto. Welcome to the Conch Republic, where the only thing frosty is your margarita glass.

Deck the Palms: Forget fir trees. In Key West, we decorate palm trees with rainbow lights, inflatable flamingos, and enough glitter to blind a cruise ship. Stroll down Duval Street and you'll see everything from Santa in board shorts to reindeer made of coconuts. The annual Lighted Boat Parade is a must—locals compete to out-bedazzle each other's vessels, resulting in floating disco balls with sails. Bonus points if you spot a boat with synchronized dancing elves.

Feast Like a Floribbean: December in Key West is peak stone crab season, so crack into some claws and dip them in mustard sauce like a true local. For a holiday twist, try conch fritters shaped like snowmen (they'll still taste like fried ocean magic). And don't miss the island's take on Christmas dinner: grilled mahi-mahi, key lime pie, and maybe a rum-soaked fruitcake that's been aging since the last hurricane.

Festivities with Flair: Key West doesn't do subtle. December is packed with events that range from charming to delightfully unhinged. The Holiday Historic Inn Tour lets you peek inside beautifully decorated B&Bs while sipping wine and pretending you're scouting locations for your next Hallmark movie. Then there's the Christmas Tree Auction, where trees are auctioned off for charity—some are traditional, others are made entirely of beer cans. It's art. It's philanthropy. It's very Key West.

Wildlife Encounters (Mostly Chickens): You'll quickly learn that the island's

unofficial mascots are the free-roaming chickens. They strut around like they own the place, and honestly, they kind of do. In December, you might catch one wearing a tiny Santa hat (locals are crafty). Just don't try to pet them—they're festive, not friendly.

New Year's Eve: Choose Your Drop: Times Square has the ball. Key West has options. At midnight on December 31st, you can choose your preferred descent:

- **The Red Shoe Drop at Bourbon Street Pub:** A drag queen is lowered from a balcony in a giant glittery heel. It's fabulous, it's iconic, and it's been featured on CNN. Eat your heart out, Ryan Seacrest.
- **The Conch Shell Drop at Sloppy Joe's:** A massive conch shell descends while revelers toast with rum and questionable decisions.
- **The Pirate Wench Drop at Schooner Wharf:** A wench swings down from the mast of a tall ship. Arrr you ready for 2026?
- **The Key Lime Wedge Drop at Ocean Key Resort:** A glowing lime wedge falls into a margarita glass. Because why not?


Pro tip: Pick your drop early and stake out a spot. Or, if you're feeling ambitious (and hydrated), try to catch all four. It's like Pokémon, but with more sequins and less cardio.

Recovery Mode: January 1st in Key West is for brunch, beach naps, and gentle rehydration. Grab a Cuban coffee, nurse your hangover with a lobster Benedict, and reflect on your choices while watching pelicans dive-bomb for breakfast. You survived the glitter, the conch shells, and the chickens. You're basically a local now.

So if you're wondering what to do in Key West in December, the answer is simple: everything. And do it with flair. Whether you're sipping eggnog on a sunset cruise or dancing under palm trees wrapped in rainbow lights, this island knows how to celebrate. Just remember—flip-flops are formal wear, chickens have right of way, and the only thing serious here is the party.

So, Lez Go Out and enjoy the weirdest, warmest winter wonderland on Earth.

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

LGBT Book Reviews by *Terri Schlichenmeyer*

“QUEER ENLIGHTENMENTS: A HIDDEN HISTORY OF LOVERS, LAWBREAKERS, AND HOMEMAKERS” BY ANTHONY DELANEY

It had to start somewhere.

The discrimination, the persecution, the inequality, it had a launching point. Can you put your finger on that date? Was it DADT, the 1950s scare, the Kinsey report? Certainly not Stonewall, or the Marriage Act, so where did it come from? In **“Queer Enlightenment: A Hidden History of Lovers, Lawbreakers, and Homemakers”** by Anthony Delaney, the story of queer oppression goes back so much further...

The first recorded instance of the word “homosexual” arrived loudly in the spring of 1868: Hungarian journalist Károly Mária Kerthbeny wrote a letter to German activist Karl Heinrich Ulrichs referring to “same-sex-attracted men” with that new term. Many people believe that this was the “invention” of homosexuality, but Delaney begs to differ.

“Queer histories run much deeper than this...” he says.

Take, for instance, the delightfully-named Mrs. Clap, who ran a “House” in London in which men often met other men for “marriage.” On a February night in 1726, Mrs. Clap’s House was raided and forty men were taken to jail, where they were put in filthy, dank confines until the courts could get to them. One of the men was ultimately hanged for the crime of sodomy. Mrs. Clap was pilloried, and then disappeared from history.

William Pulteney had a duel with John, Lord Hervey, over insults flung at the latter man. The truth: Hervey was, in fact, openly a “sodomite.” He and his companion, Ste Fox had even set up a home together.

Adopting your lover was common in eighteenth century London, in order to make him a legal heir. In about 1769, rumors spread that the lovely female spy, the Chevalier d’Éon, was actually Charles d’Éon de Beaumont, a man who had been dressing in feminine attire for much longer than his espionage career. Anne Lister’s masculine demeanor often left her an “outcast.” And as George Wilson brought his bride to North America in 1821, he confessed to loving men, thus becoming North America’s first official “female husband.”

Sometimes, history can be quite dry. So can author Anthony Delaney’s wit. Together, though, they work well inside “Queer Enlightenment.”

Undoubtedly, you well know that inequality and persecution aren’t new things - which Delaney underscores here - and queer ancestors faced them head-on, just as people do today. The twist, in this often-chilling narrative, is that punishments levied on eighteenth- and nineteenth-century queer folk was harsher and Delaney doesn’t soften those accounts for readers. Read this book, and you’re platform-side at a hanging, in jail with an ally, at a duel with a complicated basis, embedded in a King’s court, and on a ship with a man whose new wife generously ignored his secret. Most of these tales are set in Great Britain and Europe, but North America features some, and Delaney wraps up thing nicely for today’s relevance.

While there’s some amusing side-eyeing in this book, “Queer Enlightenment” is a bit on the heavy side, so give yourself time with it. Pick it up, though, and you’ll love it til the end.

exactly what my papi chulos were dirty talking to me as they banged my back out like a screen door in a hurricane.


